BACKGROUND

The College of Dietitians of Prince Edward Island (CDPEI) is responsible for developing, establishing, and maintaining the standards of licensure. The College deems assurances of applicant’s dietetic knowledge, skills, and judgement to be in the public interest. This policy sets out the assessment criteria used by the College to determine when an applicant has sufficiently demonstrated the currency of their knowledge, skills, and competence after resigning their license to practice in a Canadian jurisdiction greater than 3 years ago.

POLICY

1. Applicants for membership must meet the criteria as defined in the Regulated Health Professions Act Sections 12 and Dietitian Regulations sections 11-16.
2. Applicants for reinstatement who have not met currency requirements as defined in the Dietitians Regulations Section 14 will be subject to the following based on time lapsed since meeting active practice requirements:
 - a. 3-9 years since applicant last met active practice requirements
 - i. Submission of continuing education record including at least 30 credit hours in the past three years meeting the standards and requirements established by the council
 - ii. Successfully complete the Canadian Dietetic Registration Examination
 - b. 10 years or greater since applicant last met active practice requirements:
 - i. Successful completion of College of Dietitians of Ontario’s Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) Process
3. Upon successful completion of the reinstatement requirements outlined above applicants will be deemed to have current dietetic knowledge and skill and will be registered with the College.
